Our Story

It all started with a birthday being celebrated at an orphanage in Nalasopara on June 10th 2014. What followed gave rise to one of 'India's Coolest Youth Organizations' working for a social change. The rest as they say, is History.

Few teenagers would today decide to throw their 17th birthday party at an orphanage. If they do, it would be for all the wrong reasons. But what sets Himanshu Goenka-the Founder of Muskurahat apart from the average teen, is the nobility of his unique vision. It was after having celebrated his birthday at the Home and as the newly turned 17 year old saw a sight there, that the seeds of this tree named Muskurahat were first sown.

What happened after that birthday celebration? What happened was that he realised that whom he had thought of as only orphans also included juveniles. That truth shook him deeply, a profound realization hitting him: He would have to do something about it; and do it Now.

Most of his friends continued lending support for organizing events at various local Homes for a short while; but when the time came for commitment, most of them ended up choosing Engineering and Medical careers. Himanshu, the one who had really felt the 'passion to give back', was the only one left holding onto it. A lonesome restlessness followed; but never could that deter his decision of a lifetime that would soon be made. For now, the dilemma of a choice between his passion which was managing events and his hobby for bringing change, had found a perfect blend in the idea of a Foundation that worked for the underprivileged. To Himanshu, it was essential that this be a youth driven endeavour mainly because he wished to dispel the myths associated with social work that usually derogate the ability of the not-so- rich youth to mobilize for change.

The one unmissable fact to be mentioned here is the incredible support of the people who stood by Himanshu. He may have faltered without their unbending faith in him. This faith helped in establishing an independent entity by the name 'Muskurahat Foundation'.

Joyride was Muskurahat's first event where his dream was first transformed into reality. As the name suggests, the idea was to take street children on luxurious car and bike rides along the Queen's Necklace at Marine Drive. The difficulties faced and the impact created today, form a fond first memory. About some of the important causes that Muskurahat has supported from its foundation are menstrual hygiene, cancer care as well as awareness about the problems of senior citizens.

KEYtaab is Muskurahat's first flagship project which has today grown to six centers including two in New Delhi launched this year. July 2017 was when Muskurahat set up base in Andheri with its first office ever. Soon after this, Team Muskurahat crossed the 100 volunteers mark. After countless efforts of our volunteers, two AnganShiksha projects soon kicked off in the slums of Asalpha, India's second largest slum. Project Vastradaan was our unique cloth donation drive for the Rohingyas suffering across the borders. Masika Mahotsav and Being Women are some of our women-oriented projects whereas India's Future Tycoons was our successful collaboration with ENpower for promoting youth entrepreneurs. This year too, we saw massive project expansion with Blind Book Dates and Being Women 2.0 being the highlights.

Having come a long way, we have not only grown financially but also experientially. The existence of a full-time Core Team of 10 full time members shows how well and how much the garden has grown. Importantly, the concept of crowdfunding has enabled us to reach out to potential donors who wish to help us spread more smiles and for which we are grateful.

As the pages that follow will show, the Shades of Muskurahat are too many to count; what is needed now more than ever as we enter our fifth year and expand nationally with growing responsibility and expectation, is to ascertain that we never lose sight of our main motive because- "A smile never took anything from anybody, it only ever filled the world with more happiness than can be contained within its borders."

What we do

"A child is a reservoir of unexplored lands, map him right and the world will grow."

This is what we at Muskurahat do with every child who has trusted his hand into ours. Unlike other factors that influence his childhood focusing solely upon quantitative variables, we wish to inculcate in them a sense of and appreciation for the qualitative values of life. By building a bridge of human interaction early on in their lives, we instil in them a standardised curriculum for appropriate social behaviours and interpersonal skills.

One of the bricks used in the construction of this bridge is our Special Model of Social Difference (SMSD). All our projects are designed according to the coordinates of its structure. We believe that being 'underprivileged' cannot be the only crucial factor affecting a child's upbringing. As we see it, a child's life is shaped by the strength of his choices and the quality of his character.

These basic values evolve out of two vital factors: surrounding and upbringing. It will be hard to find an undeveloped individual with either of these areas intact.

There is something essential amiss in their personal background; hence they serve an immense scope for improvement in both the areas.

Filling the gaps is what we aim to do through our two Flagship Projects: AnganShiksha and KEYtaab as well by our year-round events.

For AnganShiksha, our main motive is to create a positive atmosphere of learning lacking in the homes of slum-children. AnganShiksha is our slum development project operating in Asalpha and Bamawada. As for KEYtaab, which functions across four Shelter Homes in Mumbai and two in New Delhi, the purpose is to ensure a consistent involvement in the upbringing cycle of orphans and abandoned children.

All of Muskurahat's events also strive to promote awareness of the various problems plaguing the marginalized of our society. Be it our womencentric projects or those involving senior citizens; Project Vastradaan for the Rohingyas or Blind Book Dates for charity, celebrating Women's Day with pop art graffiti and the street plays- all these social events impart strong anti discriminative messages against gender and cultural



Educating their angans, building our nation.

When a prominent social activist was asked about the most powerful external influence imaginable on the process of community development, he responded with only one word: environment. After this, the importance of the role played by one's surroundings in shaping one's life can hardly be overestimated. This is insight that has guided our AnganShiksha project from its founding.

By literally entering the angans of slum dwellers in Asalpha and Bamanwada every Sunday our main aim is promote community development living in the vulnerable slums of Mumbai. By improving the atmosphere of their daily life, we wish to create an impact in their overall living.

We go about pursuing this goal through a step by step process which began with the children. Children are the strongest link of any community, unprejudiced in their thinking, unhardened by harsh realities and unlimited in their dreams- they are the first step towards the peak that promises progress.

By going and conducting weekly sessions amongst them, our goal is to familiarize our presence and hence, put them at ease of giving their kids up to us. To do so has only become possible after the immense efforts of our earliest volunteers which were directed at providing the best for the kids and which finally convinced their families to send more of them, and send them willingly.

The idea behind this project is to create a pro learning, anti-abusive environment of understanding an comradeship which would usually be hard to find in any slum, and so to bring to them them the world as it exists outside their own walls.

By indulging in activities that promote interaction along with learning that isn't necessarily academic but value based, we are preparing them to build homes brighter and bigger than their current ones.



Baudh Vihar

Reached after a treacherous climb through narrow passes and steep steps, Baudh Vihar is a happy and open space. Gathering every Sunday morning, here are around 50 boys and girls who come from homes spread across Asalpha. Amid math sums and poetry reading, word games and fun quizzes -these children are safe and protected from the harsh life outside this temple of learning.



Police Chowki

Situated atop the secluded hill of Asalpha, this is where AnganShiksha's second project takes place every Sunday. Here, the kids with their bhaiya and didi volunteers are taken on long journeys through the books and the games Muskurahat brings to them every week.

Bamanwada

Bamanwada is our latest venture at Muskurahat's AnganShiksha project. Situated amidst the slums on Andheri's wild streets, these are a tougher lot to handle than those at Asalpha. Passing through open gutters and broken roofs, seeing fathers smoking hookahs while their mothers suffer in silence, nearly 40 kids from ages 4-14 years gather behind a temple where the sessions take place in secular peace, just like in Baudh Vihar.

We are today's keys, to the doors of tomorrow.

'The purpose of a book is not to educate but to inform.' In these words can be described the foundations upon which the practical philosophy of KEYtaab rests. Tasked with tackling the other aspect of our Special Model of Social Difference, KEYtaab focuses on active (youth) intervention in the upbringing cycle of children living in orphanages and shelter homes across Mumbai.

Collaboration with such Homes enables us to reach out and impact kids belonging to a huge range of age groups. Similar diversity can also be observed in their respective personal backgrounds.


Some have been rescued from horrible scenarios of parental neglect, whereas others have come straight from the streets. A few are victims of child labor and all kinds of abuses - physical, mental or even sexual.

Armed with the knowledge of their traumatic pasts, we at Muskurahat fully understand and deeply appreciate the will it takes to go on, despite everything. It is on prioritizing such urgent humane needs that KEYtaab focuses on.

By sidestepping the usual route of academic involvement and scholastic teaching, we are interested in developing interpersonal skills and shaping well-formed personalities that the kids in their current status lack. Basic abilities such as communication, English reading, general knowledge, self awareness of and about body issues- all these that we take for granted are dearly missed by these kids.

Through our Sunday Sessions as detailed further on, we wish to set these kids on such roads that will eventually lead them to good, if not great heights.










Snehasadan-Kondivita


Shelter Don Bosco

KEYtaab Bangalore


Located in the Bengaluru's district of Kodigehalli, Muskurahat's KEYtaab chapter at Bengaluru ran for a period of around six months at a home named 'Abhilashrayam'.

Here, around 25 girls between the ages of 10-15 years were taught by nearly 10 volunteers who were all locals from Bengaluru proper. A similar pattern of non-academic, extracurricular activities was followed.









Events

As per the principles of SMSD, our two projects KEYtaab and AnganShiksha look after the needs of our kids at Shelter Homes and in slums. That leaves us ample space for focusing our attention on giving our support to other events of social significance. Be it our women empowerment projects such as Ibtida, Being Women (8th March); our social upliftment endeavours in the form of our Crowdfunding events like the Charity Bake Sale or Gift a Child Christmas; our employee engagement collaborations with corporate spaces such as WeWork, 91Springboard that push for corporate charity - all such yearly events encourage individual, community and social growth. Affirming to our core values that object all forms of stereotyping and minority exclusion, Muskurahat's events reflect its ideological aims.

















Today, the average (emerging) entrepreneur is not above 18 years of age. However, how many 'schools' actually provide him with the competitive environment and global outlook that are essentially the ingredients in preparing for the future? India's Future Tycoons aims to do just that. From the seed stage till it germinates into a fully packaged pitch, IFT is there to make young and smart dreams come alive.

India's Future Tycoons is a project especially close to our Founder- President Himanshu Goenka for it not only enables him to display his event management skills but also aims to solve problems he himself had once faced. IFT is our annual collaboration with ENpower- 'The 'B' School for Teens'.



IFT 2018 was modelled along the UNS Sustainable Development with it's four main themes of #1 Education, #2 Poverty, #3 Eat Healthy & Stay Fit, #4 Water Supply & Sanitation. Alongside these there was also the Guest Panel where one of the Youth Entrepreneur -Speakers was Himanshu Goenka. Under his leadership, execution of events is Muskurahat's forte and so we were able to partner successfully with ENpower whose brain child this is.






Over 250 schools were approached by us with nearly 3000 students coming up with 1850 business ideas from across 11 cities

Ibtida

Ibtida is Muskurahat's special women empowerment project that focuses on collecting funds for financially disadvantaged women who struggle day in and out to make two ends meet. This year's edition also included reaching out to various all-women self help groups where we could find such working women and inculcate in them special skill sets. We were able to target an audience of women who are engaged in local handicraft ware but lacked business-like professionalism.

Dhruv Goenka with a set of talented volunteers taught them the art of designing diyas and of paper quilling which two things could be utilized by them to bag local business deals during festival times. This promoted not only great entrepreneurial skills in them but also enabled fuller female personalities to emerge. As for our collaboration with 91 Springboards across Mumbai, the funds we collected were handed over to these ladies in need. All of them have become very special to us because of the souvenirs they gifted everybody at 91 Springboard. This event has truly added a new dimension of possibility to our women-centric motives at Muskurahat.





Art Empower

On the event of International Women's Day and as part of our 'Being Women' initiative, this year Muskurahat decided to become the 'Voice of the Women'. Thus, we launched the 'Graffiti Pop Art Project' on the eve of Women's Day 2019. Starting sharp at 12 am on March,7th and continuing till 6 am of the next day, the mission was to paint 6 panels of the Foot Over Bridge at Andheri's South side. This was done in collaboration with graffiti artists alchemy.india, i_m_carter and Smash along with Rupesh Kumar.

The strong message of Women's Empowerment through their bold smashing of stereotypes, slogans promoting social harmony and celebration of gender inclusivity were some issues we aimed to address.





Freedom for one, Freedom for all.

The next event for Being Women was celebrated throughout 8th March. This was a street play aptly titled 'Azadi' performed on the Bandra, Andheri and Borivali stations in collaboration with Two and a Half Theatre Co. The play put forth the powerful message of how progress made by some women globally has only been possible because of the azadi they fought for and won.





A similar revolution should take place in every part of the world where women are still not azad, starting from our homes, classrooms, workplace and the country.





Other Events

Kamani Food Employee Engagement

This was an Employee Engagement program undertaken with Kamani Foods and Connect For. This was in essence a painting workshop cum project carried out at one of our KEYtaab shelter homes. Instead of just restricting ourselves to paintings, our collaborators splashed on the idea of creating some graffiti designs on the walls of their Home. This act of creativity was managed by the expert artists we got on board. However, the next day our corporate partners- all employees at Kamani Foods and Connect For who hadn't touched paint bottles since their schooldays, came over and painted the town red, as it were. Their unrestricted interaction with the kids proved as much of a stress buster for them as it did a joy for the children at Snehsadan.









Global Youth Conference

The concept of Global Youth Conference came into existence to fill the gaps that today prevents the youth of our nation from turning into the Global Leaders of tomorrow. The main goal of this collaboration was to nurture the skills of personality leadership, developing communication styles , polishing presentation skills and spreading youth empowerment - the final qualities that we strive to cultivate within not only our children but also our volunteers.



We at Muskurahat are the first ones up and jumping when it comes to putting on our 'giving gloves' and in contributing to as large a donation drive as we can. Over that prescribed week-during a span of 7 days, Muskurahat organized a total of 35 events and managed to collect a staggering amount of 1.2 lakhs from our contributors spread across 5 locations. Our collaboration with 91 Springboard hubs all over Mumbai added a golden touch of achievement to Daan Utsav 2018.





Future Projects

ENlabs

ENlabs will be the groundbreaking endeavour undertaken by ENpower whose main aim is to nurture the school going youth (especially from the age range of 13-17years) and who miss out on the opportunities that would enable them to grow the entrepreneur budding in them. Through the medium of lively and interactive learning centred around games, this project will hope to reach out to our school going kids and perform these activities once a week within that familiar environment. The design for ENlabs has provided for a facilitator to keep track of their weekly progress.

Swajeevi

The motto of Swajeevi will be to transform the youth of rural India from 'job seekers' into 'job creators'. Standing for Swapna + Jidd + Vishwas (Dream + Drive + Belief).

It starts from identification of their strength and interests through to driving their dreams to making self independent and fully capable for their challenges. Swajeevi will be Muskurahat's attempt in collaboration with ENpower to reach our rural brothers and sisters.

Holistic learning in BMC schools

Clear as it is from its name, this project will hope to socially, culturally and intellectually nourish kids from across BMC schools in Mumbai. The main concern behind this project is to expose kids to extra-academic and extracurricular learning that can naturally cannot take place within an institutional school environment. Guided by a curriculum set by our expert mentors, this project will aim at moulding a wholesome youth ready to be tomorrow's leaders.

AnganShiksha Ragpickers

As the name AnganShiksha suggests, this will be a community development project aiming at the class of society that most often gets neglected neglected i.e. Mumbai's ragpicking community. The idea is to provide their kids with a basic education model in order to open up opportunity that they too should avail of, regardless of their personal social-economic background. The guiding light of this endeavour will be to create a positive atmosphere of sustainable development for the benefit of the overall community, envisioning a community of rag pickers that is self reliant, self confident and has acquired basic problem solving skills.

Founders & Mentors























